DORIAN RELIEF FUND

Dear Friends,

On the 2nd and 3rd September the Northern Bahamas Islands received a direct hit from Hurricane Dorian, the most powerful storm to impact land ever recorded. Communities in The Abacos and Grand Bahama have been devastated and tragically a number of lives have been lost. The Government of The Bahamas and a number of local and international agencies have begun a relief effort which is focusing on the immediate human needs of all those affected. The Winterbotham Group will contribute to this relief effort and has set up Hurricane Dorian Relief Fund and opened an account to collect donations.

Many of you will have been moved by the scenes of utter devastation shown on television and we ask that you consider contributing to the fund that we have begun.

Winterbotham is making the first donation to the fund. All monies collected from donors will go to support projects designed to ensure that, once immediate essentials are in place, affected communities can recover and rebuild, with a particular focus on youth and education.
